

High-Stakes Action Beckons: Singapore Tennis Open 2025 Draws Unveiled

- Marquee clash between Anna Kalinskaya and Caroline Dolehide is set to headline the indoor hard-court tournament
 - Showdown between Elise Mertens and Taylor Townsend promises nail-biting action



SINGAPORE, **26 JANUARY 2025** – The court is set for an unforgettable week of tennis! The Singapore Tennis Open (STO) 2025 draw ceremony, officiated by Women's Tennis Association (WTA) Supervisor, Cristina Romero, unveiled a lineup of blockbuster matches. The ceremony, held at the *Gustav Klimt: Falling in Gold* exhibition, promises thrilling matchups from the get-go, with a high-stakes battle between Anna Kalinskaya and Caroline Dolehide leading to a potential quarterfinal clash with Emma Raducanu.

Key Highlights from the Singles Draw:

- Top seed Anna Kalinskaya will face off against Caroline Dolehide in a battle of former WTA 1000 finalists. A projected quarterfinal clash against Emma Raducanu awaits.
- Seventh seed Raducanu plays Cristina Busca in the first round, with their contrasting play styles expected to wow fans when they hit the court.
- Second seed Elise Mertens headlines the bottom half of the draw as she faces Australian Open women's doubles finalist Taylor Townsend in the first round.
- Fans will witness the tournament's top-ranked Asian player, Wang Xinyu, facing Rebecca Marino in a career-first meeting right here at the Kallang Tennis Hub. A battle of baseliners awaits, with a potential second-round duel against Alycia Parks, a former WTA 250 champion.
- The singles draw boasts other big names, with Australian Open 2025 mixed doubles champion Olivia Gadecki, former Roland Garros semifinalist Amanda Anisimova and Youth Olympic Games 2010 champion Daria Saville in action.

Key Highlights from the Doubles Draw:

- American top seeds Dolehide and Townsend will play all-Asian pair Moyuka Uchiyama and Xu Yifan to open their campaign.
- Doubles veterans Desirae Krawczyk and Giuliana Olmos will set the KTH alight when they face up-and-comers Madeleine Brooks and Isabelle Haverlag in the first round.
